Think-in 1: Wednesday 5 December, 9.30 - 12.00 at Mulberry School for Girls

Key idea: What we share is more powerful than what divides us

Key questions: What is it that makes us all human, that connects us?

How do we champion this to build gender equality?

Humanity, from the Latin *humanitas*, meaning human nature, civilisation, kindness **Being human** is understanding that others are human too

What makes us human is our ability to form and maintain relationships

Being human means you can think for yourself, you make mistakes, you can decide rationally, and you have instincts

Thought is **what makes us human** - ingenious, creative, productive and powerful **Being human** gives you the ability to love and have compassion

Inspired by Jude Kelly and her invited contributors, participants will collectively generate ideas and solutions that will enable more girls and women to reach their true potential as individuals and leaders.

of women and girls all over the world, bringing together artists, performers and speakers from a huge range of disciplines and backgrounds to spotlight women's lives, their successes, and the obstacles against which they continue to struggle

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Preparation

Participants will spend one hour in a structured preparation workshop in their own schools, led by the members of staff who will be bringing students to the Think-in. Stimulus materials, resources and workshop structure will be provided. Participants will also complete a personal self-reflection sheet following the workshop. Participants will bring the outcomes from the workshop and their self-reflection to the Think-in.

Participation

Participants will join others from all three Trust schools in a range of thought-provoking activities and discussions led by Jude Kelly. Through these, participants will generate a range of "Thought-gems" - key messages, learning, ideas and solutions that will be widely disseminated from the Think-in. Participants will evaluate the Think-in and identify key questions that could be pursued in Think-in 2

Follow-up

The Thought-gems will be disseminated through the digital networks of WOW, MST and partner organisations. Participants will be invited to contribute further Thought-gems, created independently possibly through art work, creative writing or film. Participants will also lead a presentation to, or discussion with, other students in their school to build their leadership skills and to widen the debate further.
